The Spoon Gathering

The seed for a unique green woodworking event was planted 17 years ago by artist and MVAS spoon carving instructor, Frank Foltz. Frank and the founders of the Spoon Gathering envisaged the creation of an event that would encourage carvers and spoon enthusiasts to gather once a year to celebrate the humble wooden spoon. What started as a small gathering of spoon carvers has grown into a vibrant and entertaining 3-day festival of carving, friendship, and learning. Each year, carvers from across the United States and beyond converge on Milan to celebrate the wooden spoon, an international symbol of family, meals, and friendship.

The Spoon Gathering today offers a family friendly event for those interested in wood spoon carving and traditional handcrafts. There is a full schedule of demonstrations, workshops, and presentations that not only center on the world of wood spoon carving, but also highlights other forms of green woodworking and the decorative arts. In past years, these have included, knife sharpening, spoon blank harvesting and shaping, axe safety, wood bowl carving, kuksa carving, birch bark weaving, blade forging, dying wood with natural dyes, chip carving and kolrosing.

The event caters to novices and absolute beginners, however the school highly recommends those new to spoon carving take a beginning spoon carving class prior to the gathering. During the event, a tent site is set up which allows beginners to access the hands-on instruction of a number of Minnesota's finest spoon carvers.

Other highlights of the weekend include a spoon exhibition by the festival attendees and a Friday evening potluck party and get-together. Free camping is available. The Spoon Gathering is a carving weekend, so bring your spoon blanks and carving tools or just come to watch and enjoy the weekend.

Venue and Dates

The school is open Sunday morning if attendees wish to use the facilities.

On Arrival

Parking

It is not permitted to park vehicles in Burns Park. Please park your vehicle on a side street. If you park on the perimeter of the park, please park nose or rear in so that we can maximize the parking space.

Checking in

On arrival, look for a festival organizer. The check in desk will be in the main school building. If you can't find an organizer, feel free to set up camp in Burns Park, across from the school. There will be a class in the school until noon on Thursday, so please wait till 1 p.m. on Thursday to check in. There is no hurry. The registration desk will be in the main room of the school building. Enter between the 2 dragons and walk down the hall.

The official Spoon Gathering welcome is held on Friday morning around 8.30 a.m.

Camping

Burns Park: Free camping is available on the Thursday, Friday & Saturday nights.

Those attending a pre-event class may camp earlier. Please inform the school.

Pick a spot in Burns Park and set up camp. Warning!!! There is a tower at the south end of the park. A very loud siren goes off at noon, 5.30 p.m. and 9.30 p.m. every day. Welcome to small town Minnesota. The siren is a tradition.

For those looking for more space or a quieter location, the field behind the Milan Community Center (old Milan High School) is available for camping and is just a short walk to downtown. The second camp ground is not supervised, so please lock all your valuables in your vehicle when not present. Due to the cost, there will not be porta potties at this location.

Restrooms

Male & female porta potties are provided in the park and in the alley on the east side of the park. There is also a bathroom in the school with the luxury of a flushing toilet and running water. Please help to keep the school bathroom clean. If the bathroom needs either toilet paper or paper roll, you will find supplies in the **Beverage Room**.

Showers

There are no showers onsite, but there are hot showers available at the Lac qui Parle State Park campground, which is about 5 minutes drive from Milan. Please try to use the park showers outside of peak camper time.

Cost:

1. If you are a current holder of a Minnesota State Parks Annual Vehicle Permit (\$25), the showers are free.
2. If you do not have an annual permit, it is possible to purchase a 1 day permit at the front gates to the upper campground (\$7). The permit is per car, so several people can enter at a time.
No key is necessary. The shower block has private cubicles entered from the exterior.

Main Red School Building

The school will be open through most of the event, so come in, relax, and use the facilities. The school will remain open in the evenings as long as carvers wish to socialize and carve. At some point in the evening, the building will be locked, but a responsible adult will open the building early in the morning.

What do I need to bring?

Please bring your own chair.

Tools you will need for carving and blanks. The school has a number of chopping blocks and 3 carving horses.

Camping equipment if you choose to camp in the park.

Cooking equipment. There are no open fires allowed in Burns Park. Gas and charcoal grills are permitted. There will also be a gas grill in front of the school available for cooking.

Cooking is also done on the fire pit in front of the school.

Coolers for food and drinks (if needed). There are no refrigeration facilities provided, but Bergen's Prairie Market has a good supply of ice.

Other Accommodations

If you wish to have full-serviced camping facilities, you will need to camp at the Lac Qui Parle State Park campground about 5 miles outside of town. Call **320-734-4450**.

A limited number of RV hookups are available in the Lions Park on Highway 7/59 in town.

Payment is by donation to the school.

For other choices of accommodation, please visit www.milanvillageartsschool.org and click on “**Location**” on the top menu. You will find there is an ample supply of reasonable accommodation within a short driving distance of Milan.

Demonstrations, Presentations & Workshops

Demonstrations, workshops, and presentations are still being finalized. All 3 days will have something on offer. Friday and Saturday are the busiest days. Some of the favorites are retained every year and new ones added to keep the event fresh. As soon as they are finalized, an email will be sent out, so please make sure you are on the school's email list for the event. As they become available, the school will also list them on the Spoon Gathering Facebook page and the school's webpage www.milanvillageartsschool.org.

Once everything is finalized, a document titled “**Schedule of Events**” will be sent out. The **Schedule of Events** is generally sent out in early May, but changes will sometimes be made prior to the event. If so, a new and final **Schedule of Events** will be sent out just prior to the weekend.

Impromptu Chalkboard Demonstrations

Keeping with the tradition of sharing knowledge freely, impromptu demonstrations are encouraged and add color and interest to the weekend. While the school arranges demonstrations and presentations for the weekend, please feel free to set up and demonstrate your particular skill. You will always get an appreciative and attentive crowd. A blackboard will be available on the front porch for you to list your demonstration, time and location. Please inform the organizers, so your demonstration is announced.

Organized Classes.

There are 2 pre-event classes being offered this year. Our guest artist, Emilie Rigby, is teaching an advanced spoon handle carving class and Fred Livesay is teaching a beginning spoon carving class. As of Apr 26, there is still room in both classes. Unfortunately, the sharpening class offered by Paul Linden is on hold as Paul is unable to attend due to family commitments. The school is reassessing the class and details will be sent out shortly.

Carving Time

The Spoon Gathering is a spoon-carving festival, so be prepared to carve. While demonstrations add to the interest of the Gathering, this is a time to meet fellow carvers, network, and work on your latest project. The event caters to beginners and novices. You will find the Spoon Gathering is a welcoming environment for all, so please feel free to ask for assistance. All are happy and willing to share their knowledge.

Spoon Blanks

Please bring along a supply of blanks. If you have extra, please bring them for sale, to barter or trade. There is always someone looking for a blank. If you do not have blanks, there is generally a supply available for sale at a reasonable price. Blanks are also available from the bandsaw site by the shelter. Please give a donation. All proceeds go toward the event.

Can I buy carving related tools at the Gathering?

Unfortunately, Del Stubbs will not be present again this year. The school and organizers are working on a sales table, which will have a variety of carving related items for sale. More information to follow.

Attendees Items for Sale

Carvers and attendees often have items for sale. If you are selling a large amount, please consider donating 5% of your profit to the Spoon Gathering. The school does not monitor sales and contributions are based on the honor system. All funds are used to help fund future Spoon Gatherings. Bartering, trading, and selling is encouraged.

Spoons on Display: Saturday

As is tradition, space and tables will be provided in the school to display your spoons on the Saturday (time to be decided). Bring along any spoons you have carved, or other spoons in your collection. While spoons are the focus, feel free to bring other items of interest, especially those related to green woodworking and carving. You are sure to find admirers.

Feel free to sell some of your items. The school is not responsible for selling items, so if you sell, please have your photo with your display so a potential buyer is able to locate you. The room will be monitored at all times. **Please label your display with your name and hometown. See one of the event organizers for labels.**

The Spoon Wheel Tent for beginners or beginners at heart.

There will be a designated area for beginners to learn from experienced carvers. There will be an "instructor" at advertised times under the smaller tent to advertise the instructor's name and time. If you are interested in being a volunteer teacher in the Spoon Wheel tent, please contact the school prior to the event.

Silent Auction

A silent auction will be held on Saturday (Saturday afternoon. Exact time to be decided). All items are welcome. All profits go to sustaining future Spoon Gatherings. If you have an item for auction, please look for **Linda Mockler**.

There are many opportunities to help during the festival. If you would like to help during the Spoon Gathering, please contact the school.

The Weather

Early June on the prairie can bring almost any type of weather. We have had rain, high temps, cold and drizzly weather, and beautiful sunny days. The prairies are often windy. The best thing to do is be prepared for any type of weather as conditions can change quickly. We will send out a final email shortly before the weekend regarding the weather. Please check the weather reports before departing home.

Music

If you play a musical instrument, feel free to bring your instruments. We encourage music, but please remember we are located in the center of town. Noise outside needs to be kept to a minimum after 10 p.m. Socializing often goes on till late into the night. Please be quiet by the fire after 10 and move inside if necessary.

Trash & Recycling

Please keep the venue tidy and free of trash. Trash bins and a dumpster are on site. Recycling bins are located in front of the school. Please clean up your site if when you leave for home. This is highly appreciated by the organizers.

Meals & Refreshments

Water

The town water is fine for drinking. It is well water, so it is not to everyone's taste. The water from the school kitchen is fine for drinking as is the water from the spigot in the park. Bergen's Prairie Market on Main St. has a supply of drinks, bottled water and ice.

Bergen's Prairie Market

Bergen's Prairie Market on main street is small, but has most of the essentials. For more variety, we recommend stopping in a larger town before coming to Milan. There is no off sale liquor in Milan. All the neighboring towns have liquor stores.

Cooking Facilities

A campfire will be located in front of the school for the purpose of relaxing and cooking. Wood is provided. There will also be a Weber gas grill in front of the school. Please keep the grill clean and turn it off once you have finished cooking. Open fires are not allowed in the park, but feel free to use a gas or charcoal BBQ.

Refreshments

Complementary Scandinavian coffee, tea, and treats will be provided throughout the weekend. A freewill donation bowl is located in the **Beverage Room**. If you would like to bring cookies or snacks for the table, please do so. Your contribution will always be appreciated.

Consumption of alcohol is allowed, but please be responsible. This is a family event. MVAS has a drug free policy.

Breakfast

MVAS provides coffee, tea, muffins and donuts in the **Beverage Room** each morning. There is also a microwave and a toaster provided. The Milan Beach Resort Cafe is a few minutes drive from Milan and is open for lunch.

Lunch

MVAS is looking at introducing new lunch options this year. **More details to follow.** The Milan Beach Resort Cafe is a few minutes drive from Milan and is open for lunch.

Potluck Party: Friday 6:00 p.m. and onwards.

In past years, the potluck party has been held on the Saturday evening. This was possible when the Gathering was a 1 day or 2 day event. By request, the potluck party was moved to the Friday evening.

If you like, please bring something to add to the table. We understand that contributing is difficult for some attendees who are traveling from afar. MVAS is looking into alternative choices this year that will make attending the dinner easier for everyone. There is a microwave in the school if you wish to reheat something. Feel free to bring refreshments of your choice. Please bring your own plate and utensils.

Frank Foltz. Founder of the Spoon Gathering

Frank Foltz was born in Mt. Pleasant, MI, where he lived until leaving for Chicago to pursue an education. He began whittling when kids were still encouraged to develop their skills with a knife, carving his first neckerchief slide with the Boy Scouts at age 11. Carving became a part of his life and after moving to Minnesota in 1976, Frank began carving wooden signs for businesses.

While finishing a degree in creative therapy in 2001, Frank began carving spoons and woodenware in the Scandinavian tradition from Minnesota hardwood and fruitwood. His spoons were a co-operative venture between his creative whimsical nature and the piece of wood with which he was working. No two pieces were alike and all were intended to be used as well as enjoyed for the elegant beauty of the wood and design. One of his main interests was reviving the use of wooden spoons in everyday life for eating as well as cooking and the carving of spoons for self and friends. To that end, he found himself spending more time teaching spoon carving as folk art. Frank was an extremely popular wood spoon carving instructor at the Milan Village Arts School for a number of years until his passing in 2009.
